Named on an NHS certificate for partial help with health costs (HC3)*

Prescriptions are FREE for a patient who has:

A valid cancer patient exemption certificate

A valid maternity exemption certificate(MatEx)

A valid medical exemption certificate (MedEx)

A valid Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC)**

A valid war pension exemption certificate

Been prescribed free-of-charge contraceptives

Prescriptions are FREE for a patient who receives:

Income support

Income-based jobseeker's allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Pension Credit Guarantee Credit

Universal Credit and meet the criteria

The prescription charge is a contribution to the NHS. It is NOT a payment to the Practice. It bears no relationship to the cost of the item.
